Snowy is a pure, white female cat about 8 years old who came from a huge colony of cats cared for by the people renting the property. Her life was in a constant battle for survival as she competed with over 65 other felines for that last morsel of sustenance. The environment was not safe for any of the cats and danger from a variety of sources lurked at every corner. Many of her colony-mates perished from the harsh circumstances they were forced to endure. Snowy was the only white cat in the colony, and stood out like a "diamond in the rough". She was a little shy, but friendly, and always came close when it was feeding time. Most cats there are trusting because the caregivers at the home, hand-fed almost all the cats when they, as kittens were born into the colony. Because of the large number of cats, eventually the felines ended up living outside exposed to the elements and the dangers of living in the woods.

RSVP Inc. has been providing food and vet care for the colony and neighboring property animals for years, and stepped up to help Snowy when we believed she may have been attacked by another animal. She sustained injuries to her head, on her left cheek and across her nose. As friendly as she is, she was shy, a bit afraid and swift, avoiding capture a few times. When Snowy was finally rescued, she was fostered by Bridget, one of our dedicated volunteers to be a barn cat. Bridget found Snowy to be friendlier as days went by and decided she should have a chance at a real home. Marissa, a second volunteer then fostered her until she was socialized enough to be put up for adoption and placed into a loving home.

Snowy knows her name and, although sometimes shy, will at times come to you when you call her. With the classic sign of "good luck", Snowy has one blue eye and one green eye, making her more stunning than she already is with her beautiful white coat. Snowy loves attention and when petted is a "purr machine." Snowy is currently being cared for by friend of RSVP Inc., Kathy from Second Loves until we are able to find Snowy her "furever" person who will provide her with the loving home she surely deserves.
